


United Arab Emirates Flag Colors





The Team of Authors of the Islamic Education curriculum is pleased to present to our dear students the Islamic Education textbook in its new form, praying to Allah, Exalted be He, that it will help them increase their knowledge, expand their perceptions, and elevate their morals; He is the All-Hearer, the All-Answerer.

The Etiquette of Reciting the Holy Qur'an

I use the miswak (siwaak) to cleanse the smell of my mouth before reciting the Holy Qur'an.









I must be completely clean when reciting the Holy Qur'an.




I Read, and Compare

Rashid returned home after completing the lessons of memorizing the Qur'an. His father asked him: "What did you learn today from the lessons of reciting the Holy Qur'an? Rashid said: "the tutor has taught us today that the Istia'thah and the Basmalah are among the morals of recitation. I learned the following":

Istia'dhah

We say it before starting reciting either at the beginning or in the middle of the Qur'anic verses. The words of Istia'dhah are:



['a'ūdhu bi-llāhi mina sh-shayṭāni r-rajīmi].

Basmalah

We say it at the **beginning** of the Qur'anic verses except for the Suraht At-Taubah.

When the Prophet, peace be upon him, was forty years old, and while he was in the cave on one day of the month of Ramadan, he received the revelation through Gabriel, peace be upon him, who came down to him and said: "Read." Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, replied: "I cannot read." Gabriel embraced him strongly and then left him. For the second time Gabriel said: "Read." The Prophet, Peace be upon him, said: "I cannot read." Gabriel, Peace be upon him, embraced him for the third time and then released him saying: (Read! In the Name of your Lord, Who has created (all that exists) (1) Has created man from a clot (a piece of thick coagulated blood) (2) Read! And your Lord is the Most Generous, (3) Who has taught (the writing) by the pen (4) Has taught man that which he knew not (5).

The Messenger of Allah, peace be upon him, started memorizing these verses until he learned them by heart, and left the cave very terrified. When he reached his home, tired and frightened, he asked his wife Khadijah, may Allah be pleased with her: 'cover me, cover me,' and she hurried to cover him. After his fear had somewhat become less, he told her what had happened to him. She reassured him saying: "Cheer up, my dear cousin, for I hope that you are the prophet of this nation." 

The Prophet's Mosque

The Prophet's Mosque (Arabic: Al-Masjid an-Nabawi) is the second holiest mosques of Allah after the Grand Mosque (Al-Masjid al-Haram). Prayer in the Prophet's Mosque is equal to one thousand prayers elsewhere.



The Prophet's Sacred Chamber

It is the A'isha bint Abi Bakr's room, where she lived with Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, and where he was buried after his death. Later, Abu Bakr and Omar ibn al-Khattab, may Allah be pleased with them, were also buried in this room.

The Holy Prophet's Mihrab (the prayer niche)

The Mihrab is located in the Holy Rawdha to the left of the pulpit .



The Holy Rawdha

The Holy Rawdha is located in the Prophet's Mosque between the Minber and the room of the Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him. For Muslims, the virtue of the Holy Rawdha lies in the following Hadith of the Prophet, peace be upon him: "Between my house and my pulpit (Minber) a garden from the Gardens of Paradise, and my pulpit is over my lake." (Agreed upon).



The Prophet's Pulpit (Minber)

The Prophet's Mosque (Arabic: Al-Masjid an-Nabawi) is the second holiest mosques of Allah after the Grand Mosque (Al-Masjid al-Haram). Prayer in the Prophet's Mosque is equal to one thousand prayers elsewhere.



The Green Dome

A dome built above the Prophet's Sacred Chamber which is located inside the Prophet's Mosque in Medina.



The first verses of the Holy Qur'an ordered the Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, to read the Holy Qur'an's verses revealed to him through Gabriel (the Angle of Revelation), peace be upon him, and convey them to all people. He should seek help from his Almighty Lord, Who created everything. He created man from a piece of blood and taught him the use of pen and all of the sciences and knowledge.

The noble verses also showed that wrongdoers respond to graces and favors bestowed upon them by Allah by disobeying His commands. The more Allah's graces increase, the more rebellious the wrongdoer is, thinking that he will not be in need of his Lord. He forgets that Allah, glory be to Him, is more powerful than him, and that he will return to his Lord on the Day of Judgment, as was the case of Abu Jahl, who tried to prevent Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, from praying around the Ka'bah. Allah, glory be to Him, warned Abu Jahl of the torment on the Day of Judgment if he did not stop harming the Prophet, peace be upon him. At the end of the Surah, Allah ordered his Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, to obey Him, to seek to gain favor with Allah through worship and prayer and to ignore (the rudeness of) Abu Jahl.

Honorable Hadith

It was narrated that Abi al-Dardaa', may Allah be pleased with him, said that the Prophet, peace be upon him, said: "Nothing is heavier on the believer's balance on the Day of Judgment than good morals." (Narrated by Al-Tirmidhi)

I explain the following terms:

- O Believer: obedient to Allah in all matters.
- Balance: what people's deeds are weighed by.





The Overall Meaning of the Hadith:

Our Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, is our role model in practicing the good morals that Allah, glory be to Him, has commanded us to abide by. He has made them among the best deeds that will be taken into account on the Day of Judgment. On that day, Allah, glory be to Him, sets a balance by which the deeds of each person are judged as either good or bad. The good morals are the heaviest deeds in this balance.



I Cooperate with my Classmates

Rashid asked his mother: "I have done my big brother Sa'eed something wrong, what should I do so that he would forgive me?"

Mother: any Muslim must improve his morals in dealing with others. Whenever he does them anything wrong, he apologizes to them and treats them with the good morals he wishes to be treated with.

Rashid: Is it enough to ask him to forgive me?

Mother: you apologize to your brother while looking at him; thus he will feel your apology, and realize your honesty and respect for him. If you have done him wrong in the presence of other people, you must apologize to him in front of them, if he asks you to do so. You should not discuss with him the matter that was the cause of your disagreement unless the discussion would help clarify things. But be careful, Rashid, not to repeat the bad actions that you have done before to others. By saying phrases like: "Forgive me .. I am sorry" many times you would lose their trust in you. We, my son, must be keen on practicing the deeds that make our balance heavier, and avoid those that make it lighter.







Prophet Solomon, peace be upon him, and the Hoopoe



Prophet Solomon, peace be upon him, asked about the Hoopoe, threatening that he would slaughter him if it did not come with a good excuse to justify his absence. When it returned, the Hoopoe apologized for his absence, telling the Prophet Solomon, peace be upon him, what he had seen, saying: "In the land of Sheba in Yemen, I saw a wonderful kingdom full of all good riches and resources, and a great queen with a big army. But they worship something other than Allah, Who bestowed upon them the riches that I cannot describe."



Then, Prophet Solomon, peace be upon him, wrote a letter to Sheba's Queen calling upon her to believe in no one but Allah, glory be to Him. He ordered the Hoopoe to deliver the message in the Queen's palace without being seen by anyone and to wait to see what she and her people would do.



When the gift was delivered to Prophet Solomon, peace be upon him, he returned it to them, and ordered the Queen and her throne to be brought to him. 


The Overall Meaning of the Hadith:


Allah, glory be to Him, shows mercy to his worshippers, forgives those whose obedience to Him is declined, and multiplies the rewards of His obedient servants. No matter how much the sins made by a Muslim are, they will be forgiven and erased by Allah, glory be to Him. Minor sins are wiped out by good deeds; major sins require sincere repentance by avoiding them, with the intention of not doing them again until they are forgiven by Allah, glory be to Him.

By practicing the ritual of fasting, Allah, glory be to Him, may forgive our sins and increase our good deeds.

The invocation (du'aa) by a fasting person, at the time of breaking the fast at sunset, is answered. 

Al-Ahilla (the crescents) is the plural of Hilal (a crescent); an expression of the newborn moon in its first phase, from which it moves to the phase of the full moon, followed by the phase of the reduced crescent, and ends at that of the new moon (al-Muhaq).



This precise system is created by Allah, glory be to him, as a means that helps us know the calculation of days, months and years through the phases of the moon. It appears as a crescent, then a full moon, and returns as a crescent until it disappears. The moon takes astronomical positions that change according to the days of the month.

When he woke up, he heard Jibril (Gabriel), peace be upon him, saying to him: "Allah, glory be to Him, knows all that has passed between you and these people. He has ssent to you the angel who is in charge of the mountains to be at your command."

Saying this, Jibril ushered the angel before the Prophet, peace be upon him. The angel greeted him and said: "O, Muhammad! Allah heard what your people had said to you. 


The Owners of the Orchard
