



Dear editor,

I want to share you my opinion about shoplifting and retail theft which may not seem like a major crime. But to the small business fighting for survival, it's murder. There is a retail theft committed every five seconds in this country, these thefts cost each store owner \$150 a year. No store is immune.

I would like also to say that, in most cases, however, prosecution is in order. It is essential if the shoplifter is violent, if he or she lacks proper identification and you suspect a prior record, if he or she appears to be under the influence of alcohol or other drugs, it the theft involves merchandise of great value, or if the shoplifter appears to be a professional.

In my opinion, juvenile shoplifters require special handling. A strict, nononsense demeanor often makes a lasting impression on the young offender and may deter future theft, While many stores choose to contact the parents of young shoplifters rather than the police, remember that the juveniles account for half of all shoplifting that goes on in this country. The parents of troubled youngsters may be ineffective in handling the situation.

Justin was happy because the coach gave him another chance.


